Development, see notes below.

-As referenced in the previous note regarding changes to the Sheltered Count, the 2019 Count showed a higher utilization of TH services, and increases in utilization across permanent housing projects reported in the 2019 HIC. These factors are understood to be related to the reduction in unsheltered persons.

-The AL501 CoC is committed to prioritizing chronically homeless persons and unsheltered persons/ families through the Coordinated Entry. As such, these households are targeted for referral to supportive services and assistance, including the RRH programs and Permanent Housing programs. -Development continues to encroach upon wooded areas throughout the CoC\'s coverage area, with rates of development in Baldwin Co. reaching unprecedented levels. Well established encampments throughout newly developed areas continue to be disbanded, resulting in diminished counts of unsheltered persons in areas historically considered "hot spots" for this population. The extent to which the former occupants of these encampments continue to reside in the CoC in an unsheltered environment, have relocated outside the CoC\'s geographic area, or are otherwise no longer unsheltered is not fully known.

-There were extreme weather warnings the day of PIT, with heavy rains and flooding risks throughout the day. Although the weather improved significantly by the time volunteers began canvassing that night, there is an expectation this may have prompted some unsheltered persons to move for safety, resulting in movement to locations less accessible/ visible to surveyors (i.e. abandoned homes/ buildings).
